THE KRONOBERG CHILD MODEL

The Kronoberg child model is an approach that provides your child with good, equal conditions in which to grow up. Whatever the unit, we work together to provide support and help, with the child's needs at the centre.

The Kronoberg child model aims to create the right conditions to meet EVERY child's needs faster and more effectively, and to create a safe and secure childhood through promotive, early and cooperative actions.

The model is based on the Convention on the Rights of the Child and the child's right to be involved.

It is largely based on creating trust not just between the child, parent/guardian and units in society but also between the different units.

THE 'FOR THE GOOD OF THE CHILDREN' WHEEL

The 'For the Good of the Children' wheel is used to examine everything in the child's life that affects it as it grows up. You and your child will encounter the wheel in various contexts, as it is used at nursery school, school and in the Child Health Service, among other places. The wheel helps to ensure that everyone around your child is speaking the same language.



WHAT DOES THE KRONOBERG CHILD MODEL INVOLVE?

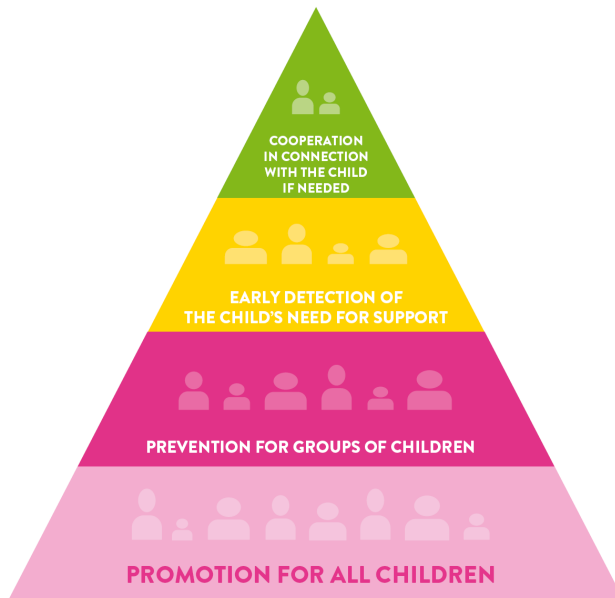
There are various parts to the Kronoberg child model. Essentially, all units must work in a promotive and preventive way in order to ensure that as many children as possible have their needs met without requiring specific input from society (the two lowest parts of the pyramid).

In the next stage (the yellow part of the pyramid), we pay attention to any

support and help requirements so that we can deal with these at as early a stage as possible.

This may be early in the child's life, but also early in a course of events – for example, if something has happened in the child's life or surroundings.

The top stage (the green part of the pyramid) is about all relevant parties needing to work together effectively with and around the child when such cooperation is needed.



Various units need to be able to share important information with each other in order for cooperation regarding your family to be effective. To support your family to best effect, information is shared that is:

- relevant
- necessary
- proportionate
